  - Play 8 measure piece with accidentals rhythms same as above, in Major or a minor scales
  - Violin 8 measure piece in 1<sup>st</sup> pos only. Rhythms same as above

- Major or minor chords
- Intervals 2-8 distance only
- 3 or 4 beats in measure
- rhythmic dictation: 4 measures 4/4, eighth, quarter, half, dotted half, and whole notes dotted quarter eighth
- melodic dictation: 2 measures 4/4, steps and repeated notes only, quarter, half, dotted half, and whole. No accidentals
